

Developmental Disability Services for Children

What is the Developmental Disability (DD) Services for Children program?

Each county in Oregon manages its own program for Developmental Disability Services (frequently called "DD"). This program provides case management to children (and adults) with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. The case manager helps families identify and connect with services and supports. They also authorize and monitor funding for in-home supports (ex. K-Plan, Respite Care, etc.).

Can DD services pay for my child's therapies (like OT, ABA, Speech, etc.)?

No. DD Services do not fund therapies.

What is considered a developmental disability according to this program?

Developmental disabilities (DD) are neurological conditions that originate in the brain and directly affect the brain. Some examples: Autism Spectrum Disorder, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, traumatic brain injuries, etc.

How do I apply for DD Services?
